Preparation Reminders for the Semester

Disability Accommodations - JMU abides by Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 and the Americans with Disabilities Act. Be sure to check *MyMadison* for your course's Accommodate section that identifies students with approved ODS accommodations. Faculty are required to know what these accommodations are and comply accordingly. Where needed for a course assignment or activity accommodation, faculty may check with students without requesting clarification on any conditions or considerations that create the designated accommodation. For instance, if a course assignment requires travel for someone with a mobility concern, how is this course requirement accommodated without causing an additional burden for the student? Our goal is to build a positive relationship with all our students regardless of accommodations.

Religious Accommodations - All faculty are required to give reasonable and appropriate accommodations to students requesting them on grounds of religious observation, as stated in the [Faculty Handbook](#), III.A.17. Please be reminded that the Hindu, Islamic, and Jewish communities have major observances as this semester starts. With over an estimated 4,000 religions, we must trust the integrity of those requesting accommodation and respond accordingly.

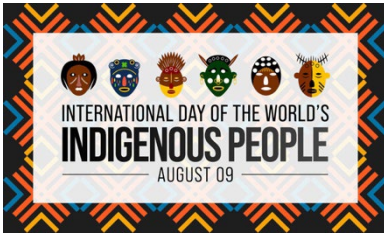
- **August 26 - Women's Equality Day**

Help for Postpartum Depression

One in seven women experiences postpartum depression within the first year following delivery, including symptomology associated with PTSD, obsessive-compulsive disorders, anxiety, substance use disorders, or other mental health concerns. The [Food and Drug Administration](#) has approved an oral tablet designed to reduce symptoms. Historically women experiencing post-childbirth "melancholy" were believed to be possessed by evil spirits, though not to have control over their emotions, considered hysterical, and failed to connect with their infant. New perspectives and treatment help us better understand the symptoms and reduce the disparity in treatment and social stigma that has occurred.

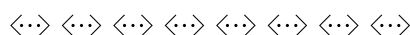


[Learning Access through Universal Design \(LAUD\) Initiative](#): Using a Chrome or Firefox web browser, log in to JMU Canvas with DUO authentication, and click “Enroll in Course”. You should be able to see the course from a teacher’s (developer) and student’s perspective (faculty). LAUD is a Canvas-based learning tool to improve student learning experiences online and in classrooms. Faculty members may self-pace their learning through specific sections for development such as improving their Canvas course site accessibility, developing a more inclusive syllabus, improving presentations with accessibility in mind, considering inclusive student assessment, or working on adding inclusive language to course content materials/activities.

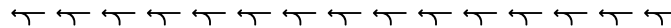

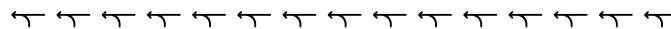


The Neurodiverse Student and the Important Role of Faculty
